Confessions: Call the parish office.

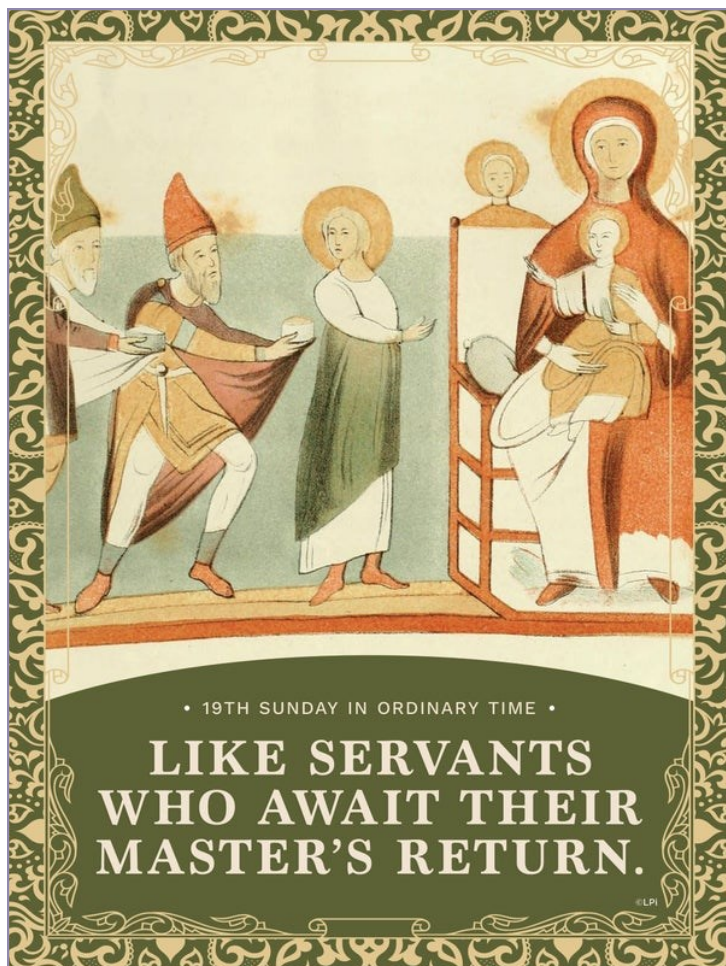
Communal Penance: Scheduled in Lent and Advent.

Pastor's Sunday Reflection

Reflection on Luke 12:32-48

Jesus begins this passage with profound reassurance, telling his "little flock" not to fear because the Father has chosen to give them the kingdom—a reminder that God's generous heart stands behind all spiritual provision. The call to sell possessions and give to the poor represents more than charitable duty; it reflects a fundamental reorientation of values where earthly security gives way to treasures that neither decay nor can be stolen. The parable of the watchful servants emphasizes the tension between present responsibility and future hope, suggesting that faithful living requires both active engagement with current duties and readiness for Christ's return.

Peter's question about the audience for these teachings reveals a common human tendency to wonder whether spiritual demands apply equally to all people or exist on different levels for different roles. Jesus responds with the parable of the faithful and wise manager, which illustrates how spiritual responsibility increases with the authority and knowledge one has been given. The sobering warning about the servant who abuses his position during the master's absence speaks directly to the danger of using spiritual authority for selfish gain rather than faithful service.

The principle that "to whom much is given, much will be required" establishes a divine economy where privilege and responsibility are inseparably linked, challenging any notion that spiritual gifts or material blessings are merely for personal benefit. This passage ultimately calls believers to live with an eternal perspective that transforms how they handle possessions, exercise authority, and wait for God's kingdom to be fully revealed.

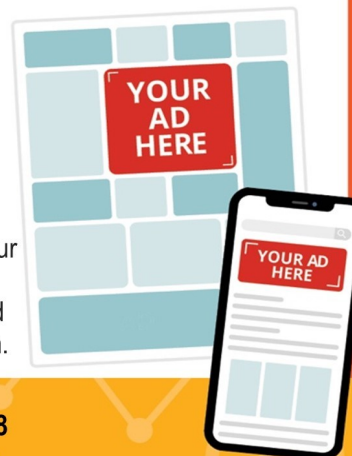
