**Weddings:** Arrangements are to be made at least one year in advance by calling the parish office.



## **Pastor's Sunday Reflection**

#### **Gaudete Sunday:**

This Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent, is Gaudete Sunday. On Gaudete Sunday, as on Laetare Sunday in Lent, the church invites us to put our Advent penitential disposition on hold and rejoice at the impending reality of human redemption. The general liturgical mood of Gaudete Sunday is exuberant.

Gaudete Sunday marks the mid-point in our Advent journey, and is a welcome break from Advent's penitential discipline. The first reading captures the joyful mood of this Sunday with this invocation: "Shout for joy, O daughter Zion! Sing joyfully, O Israel! Be glad and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem!" (Zeph. 3:14). The reason for this joy is not only because the Lord has removed the judgment against his people and turned away their enemies, but more so because the King of Israel, the Lord, is in our midst (Zeph. 3:15). Of course, we know it is not yet Christmas, but the very thought of Christmas fills us with joy. This joy is a special gift we strive to share with others and is reflected on Christmas cards and the goodwill messages they convey.

Our celebration of Gaudete Sunday reminds us of the need for more vigilance and deeper commitment to our Christmas preparation. By giving us a foretaste of the glory that lies ahead, Gaudete Sunday generates greater awareness and renewed commitment to Advent. Gaudete Sunday enables us to see the light at the end of the tunnel and reinforces our commitment to get there.

## RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS The Well That Never Dries Up

Depending on how your mood is today, the words of Paul will hit you differently. "Rejoice always," he tells us. Well, if your football team is poised to win this weekend or next, maybe you're really feeling this vibe. But if you've got a long slog at work ahead of you this week and a to-do list that only seems to grow and never shrink, it may make you grumble. "Rejoice always? Always? When I'm tired? Cranky? When I'm sick of doing and giving? Thanks, Paul. I'll be sure to scribble that phrase on a Post-It and stick it to my dashboard for when some entitled punk inevitably cuts me off on tomorrow's morning commute."

When we feel this way, we know it's time to head back to the well. Think of all the places in Scripture where God compares His love, His mercy, His salvation to water. And not just any water — living water, water that moves. God's strength is not a stagnant puddle sure to evaporate and disappear. It's water you can keep coming back to. It's water that never dries up.

Which is good news for us, because we never stop failing to do what we should, never stop failing to feel the joy and the compassion and the selflessness we are called to. We need a source of living water if we are going to 'rejoice always.' To be everyday stewards, we need a well that never empties.

The fountain of salvation never dries up. There is always more there for us to draw from. It's a sign of His commitment — so let us, in turn, be committed to Him.
