Confessions: Call the parish office.


Communal Penance: Scheduled in Lent and Advent. Funerals: Call the parish office in the event of the death of a loved one.

Pastor's Sunday Reflection

Learning to Pray: Reflections on Luke 11:1-13

"Lord, teach us to pray." These simple words from one of Jesus' disciples have echoed through the centuries, expressing a longing that remains as relevant today as it was two thousand years ago. In Luke 11:1-13, we discover not just a prayer to memorize, but a window into the heart of our relationship with God.

The Disciples' Request

The passage begins with Jesus at prayer, and when he finishes, a disciple makes this earnest request. Notice that the disciples didn't ask Jesus to teach them to preach or perform miracles—they asked to learn to pray. They recognized something profound in Jesus' prayer life that they wanted for themselves.

How often do we approach prayer as an afterthought or obligation rather than the vital communication with our heavenly Father that it truly is? The disciples saw prayer as essential, not optional.

The Pattern of Prayer

Jesus responds by giving them what we know as the Lord's Prayer, though Luke's version is shorter than Matthew's account. This prayer provides a framework that addresses our relationship with God, our daily needs, our relationships with others, and our spiritual protection.

The prayer begins with "Father," immediately establishing the intimate relationship we have with God. We don't approach a distant deity, but a loving parent who desires to hear from us and provide for us.

Persistence in Prayer

Jesus follows the Lord's Prayer with a parable about a friend who persistently asks for bread at midnight. The message isn't that God is reluctant and needs to be worn down by our requests. Rather, it's about the confidence we should have in approaching God and the assurance that he will respond to our needs.

The Greek word translated as "persistence" can also mean "shamelessness" or "boldness." We can approach God with holy boldness, confident in his love and willingness to hear us.

The Father's Good Gifts

Jesus concludes this teaching with a beautiful comparison: "If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!" This isn't about getting everything we want, but about trusting that God knows what we truly need and will provide it.

Notice that Luke specifically mentions the Holy Spirit as the ultimate gift the Father gives. While we may ask for many things, what we need most is God's presence and power in our lives.


Living This Truth

This passage challenges us to examine our own prayer lives. Do we approach God with the confidence of children speaking to a loving father? Do we persist in prayer, not to change God's mind, but to align our hearts with his will? Do we trust that God knows our needs better than we do?

Prayer is not a religious duty to check off our list, but the lifeline of our relationship with God. In a world full of noise and distraction, may we follow the disciples' example and earnestly seek to learn how to pray—not just the words, but the posture of heart that makes prayer a transformative dialogue with our heavenly Father.

As we reflect on this passage this week, may we approach the throne of grace with confidence, knowing that our Father delights to hear from his children and provide for our every need.
