Pastor's Sunday Reflection

The first reading this Sunday gives us a good idea of conflict resolution in the early Church. Paul and Barnabas had great success in their first missionary journey through Cyprus and the regions of Pisidia and Pamphylia, despite persecution. They returned to Antioch where their ministry to the Gentiles had been incredibly successful.

It happened that some Christian Pharisees (also known as 'Judaizers) from Jerusalem took it upon themselves to visit the church in Antioch. They had close ties to Judaism and required that Gentiles must first undergo circumcision in accordance with the Mosaic Law before becoming Christians. This was contrary to the teachings of Paul and Barnabas who strongly objected to this doctrinal position. As they could not come to an agreement on this important issue, they sent a delegation to the church in Jerusalem for consultation with the apostles and elders. It shows a clear recognition of the authority of the church in Jerusalem on matters of doctrine. That will be the equivalence of appealing to Rome. The delegation included Paul and Barnabas.

The deliberation that went on among the apostles and elders in Jerusalem constituted the First Council of Jerusalem. At the Council, both Peter and James, leaders of the Church in Jerusalem sided with Paul and Barnabas. Eventually, they sent a letter back to Antioch with another delegation that included Paul, Barnabas, Judas (also known as Barsabbas) and Silas, distancing the Jerusalem church from the position taken by the Judaizers.

The letter made clear that the Judaizers had no official mandate from the church in Jerusalem when they came to Antioch as doctrinal police. It also recognized that the Judaizers' teachings had been unsettling to the Gentile converts, disturbing their peace of mind. The letter stated, "It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities, namely, to abstain from meat sacrificed to idols, from blood, from meats of strangled animals, and from unlawful marriage. If you keep these, you will be doing what is right." Of course, the bottom line was that Gentiles were not required to become Jews before becoming Christians. Adult circumcision was a risky and painful experience that the Gentile converts had little interest in going through. Due to this timely intervention, the Gentile converts in Antioch rejoiced and felt encouraged in their new faith.

In the Gospel (John 14:23-29), Jesus reiterates that loving God means keeping God's words. Those who do not love God do not keep his words.

Keeping God's words is the same as keeping God's commandments. Of course, the greatest of the commandments is the command to love God and neighbour. Loving our neighbour entails avoiding actions that would cause them unnecessary pain and hardship. It also means being understanding and flexible in dealing with situations.

Jesus also states that he would not be with the apostles much longer. He would be going back to the Father, but will not leave them home alone. He will send the Holy Spirit as a gift from the Father. The Holy Spirit would teach them everything they needed to know and dispel their fears. Obviously, the gospel is hinting at the upcoming celebration of Ascension and Pentecost. Ascension makes Pentecost necessary.
