Pastor's Sunday Reflection

Reflection upon the Dedication the Lateran Basilica in Rome

Today we celebrate the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, the cathedral church of Rome and the "mother church" of all Catholic churches worldwide. In our Gospel reading, Jesus cleanses the Temple, driving out the merchants and moneychangers who had turned his Father's house into a marketplace. His passionate act reminds us that sacred spaces matter—they are set apart for encountering the living God, not for worldly commerce or distraction. Yet Jesus also speaks mysteriously about destroying "this temple" and raising it in three days, pointing beyond the physical building to his own body. After the resurrection, the disciples understood: the ultimate temple is Christ himself, and through baptism, we too become living temples of the Holy Spirit. As we honor this ancient basilica today, we're called to remember that every church building points us toward the greater reality of God's presence dwelling within his people. We must ask ourselves: Do we treat our own bodies and souls as holy temples worthy of God's dwelling? May we dedicate ourselves anew to being living stones in the Church, radiating Christ's presence to a world hungry for the sacred.

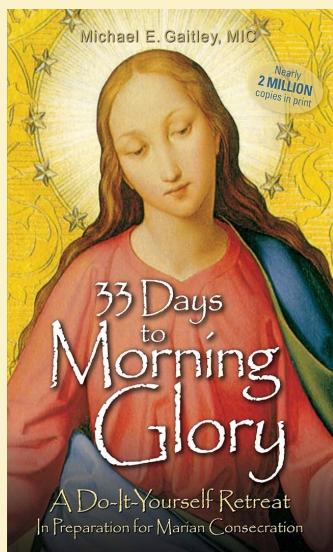
