Pastor's Sunday Reflection

Reflection: Luke 17:5-10

When the apostles ask Jesus to increase their faith, they reveal a common misunderstanding about how faith works in our relationship with God. Jesus responds with the striking image of faith as small as a mustard seed being able to uproot a mulberry tree and plant it in the sea, suggesting that the issue isn't the quantity of our faith but rather our willingness to trust completely. The parable that follows about the servant who works in the field and then serves his master dinner illustrates a profound truth about our posture before God. We are called to serve not because we earn God's favor through our works, but because faithful service is simply what disciples do. Jesus reminds us that after fulfilling all our duties, we should consider ourselves "unworthy servants" who have only done what was expected. This teaching challenges our culture's emphasis on recognition and reward, calling us instead to find joy in faithful obedience itself. True discipleship means serving God not for what we might receive in return, but because we belong to Him. In a world that constantly asks "what's in it for me," Jesus invites us to discover the freedom that comes from serving with no strings attached.

The staff from the 5 parish collaboration gathered for a retreat on Sept. 25th to learn how to work together and better serve our community.

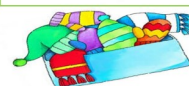
