Pastor's Sunday Reflection:

In this Sunday's gospel, some Pharisees who wanted to test Jesus asked him whether it is lawful for a husband to divorce his wife. They acknowledged that Moses permitted a bill of divorce. Jesus went on to say that it was only because of the hardness of the human heart that Moses made that allowance. He stated that from the beginning, God created them, male and female, to be joined together as one in marriage, not to be separated.

As you know, this was one of the most difficult teachings of Jesus. In trying to clarify it to the disciples when they got to the house, he further strengthened his argument against divorce by attaching the sin of adultery to those who remarry. This teaching is as difficult today as it was at the time of Jesus. Divorced and remarried Catholics who do not get annulment are not allowed to receive communion. On account of the high rate of divorce in our society, many Catholics find themselves under this category, especially those hesitant to go through the cumbersome and lengthy process of annulment.

In 2015, the Holy Father issued a document titled, *Mitis Iudex Dominus Iesus*, that makes provision for a simpler form of the annulment process as a gesture of goodwill in the Year of Mercy. The changes are more procedural in nature and do not affect the theology of annulment. They are not meant to encourage divorce and remarriage in contravention of Jesus' intentions as stated above, but to alleviate some of the sufferings of civilly divorced couples seeking annulment in order to move on with their lives and to receive Holy Communion.

The first of these changes eliminates the need for automatic appeal. Normally, once an annulment was granted, it had to be automatically appealed to the Tribunal of a neighboring Diocese. Obviously, this lengthened the annulment time and process. Now, once an annulment is granted it takes effect immediately without a built-in automatic appeal, unless one or both parties to the case request it.

Another change involves the appropriate Tribunal hearing the case. Normally, an annulment case is to be heard in the Diocese where the marriage took place. Now, it is expanded to include the Diocese where one of the partners resides or where most of the evidence is located. This eliminates the inconvenience of shuttling back and forth for those who had moved from that diocese. The Pope also encourages diocesan tribunals to reduce or eliminate the fees associated with annulment in other to make it more affordable.
