Critical Populations:

Isolated; unable to access basic needs – food, medication, health care, etc.; high risk groups associated with COVID-19; lacking social supports; at risk for neglect or abuse; not eligible for federal or other assistance; unable to access assistance due to barriers of language and culture, lack of technology, age, health or disability, mental health conditions.

- Frail seniors and disabled adults
- Pregnant women 53206 and neighboring Milwaukee zip codes impacted by poverty and poor birth outcomes particularly for the African American population
- Spanish-speaking families without resources
- Refugees experiencing difficulties navigating support systems
- Parents with intellectual disabilities

- Emotional impact of isolation
- Fears of contracting COVID-19 preventing necessary outreach for help or services
- Unemployment barriers to receiving benefits
- Anxiety, depression, grief, and other mental health conditions
